A VERY EARLY BLOOMER, CHAPARRAL CURRANT BRIGHTENS JANUARY (NOVEMBER-THROUGH MARCH, REALLY.) WITH ITS SHELL PINKTO WHITE, DANGLING 5" BLOSSOMSTHAT ARE OFT VISITED BY HUMMINGBIRDS JUST WHEN THEY NEED IT MOST. A PRETTY, CALIFORNIA NATIVE SHRUB REACHING 5-7 FEETHIGH BY 4-5 FEET ACROSS, IT GROWS WELL IN THE SHADE OF NATIVE OAKS REQUIRING LITTLE ADDITIONAL, IF ANY, SUMMER WATER MORE DROUGHT AND SUNTOLERANT THAT MOST OF THE CALIFORNIA CURRANTS, ITS ROUNDED SHAPE AND SOFT GREEN LEAVES PROVIDE A LOVELY BACKOROP LATER IN THE SEASON FOR OTHER BLOOMING PLANTS. CAPABLE AS ARE MANY CALIFORNIA NATIVES, OF SUMMER DORMANCY WHEN CONDITIONS REQUIRE IT, IT CAN BE ENCOURAGED TO STAY AWAKE BY MULCHING AND A BIT OF ADDITIONAL WATER. REALLY NICE. MOSTLY SUNTO PART SHADE
