



TEXAS SUNDROPS

CALYLOPHUS BERLANDIERI

AKA: CALYLOPHUS DRUMMONDIANUS

WHAT A BRIGHT BLOOMING ADDITION TO THE DROUGHT-TOLERANT GARDEN! THIS LITTLE SOUTHWEST NATIVE WILDFLOWER PRODUCES A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNT OF VIVID YELLOW, CREPE PAPER BLOSSOMS OVER A LONG SEASON. THE FINE-TEXTURED FOLIAGE UNDER THE CHEERFUL BLOOMS STAYS CLOSE TO THE GROUND AT UNDER 12" HIGH AND SPREADS TO 3' ACROSS. CLOSELY RELATED TO THE EVENING PRIMROSES, BUT WITH FLOWERS THAT STAY OPEN THROUGH THE DAY, TEXAS SUNDROPS ARE A GOOD NECTAR SOURCE FOR DIURNAL POLLINATORS. PROVIDE GOOD DRAINAGE BY PLANTING ON SLOPES OR TO SPILL OVER WALLS. MAKES A NICE CONTAINER PLANT, TOO! CUT BACK AFTER BLOOM AND IN FALL TO THICKEN THE PLANT AND PROMOTE REPEAT BLOOMING.
